

# servant sayings

The following Advent Reflection is from The December, 1987 Mennonite Church of the Servant newsletter, Volume 11, Number 12. Cindy Kauffman Zehr was the editor/compiler.

### **Reflecting on Advent**

Advent means "coming" or "arrival." It is the season of the year when we reflect on Jesus' coming-- not only his coming as a baby, but his continual coming into our lives and into the world in new ways to set things right.

How has Christ come to you in the past? Through events? relationships? prayer? insight?

Sometimes Christ comes with compassion and comfort, assuring us that we are loved. Sometimes Christ's coming scares us. We are like the shepherds, whose first response to the angel's announcement was fear.

When Christ comes to us, we either reject him or we change-- and that change may be difficult. But our assurance is that God is with us, Immanuel, and God loves us and wants to lead us into right relationship with God, with our brothers and sisters in the church, and with all the world.

During Advent, you may want to study the following Scripture passages for each of the Sunday's of Advent:

December 2: Isaiah 2:1-5 December 9: Isaiah 11:1-10 December 16: Isaiah 35:1-10

December 23: Isaiah 7:10-16; Mt. 1:18-25

God of Advent,

in the darkest days and nights of the year, our hearts turn toward your promised light.

With the first glimmer of a single candle dancing into the light of many bright flames, our hope is ignited once more.

In these Advent days, lead us in your light to a manger where the face of God shines bright and clear. AMEN

- On New Year's Eve come to worship and prayer at 8:00 p.m., third floor, Aley House. A party will follow at the Zehr's house.




