The Wichita Coalition Against Gun Violence was active twenty years ago, successfully passing a gun safety ordinance, one of the strongest in the state. The Coalition has been reactivated to challenge the recent state laws that require no background checks or firearms training. The goals of the coalition are public education, legal challenges to existing gun laws, and legislative action.

The first event organized by the Wichita Coalition Against Gun Violence was a rally on July 17, to commemorate the deaths of nine church members in Charleston, South Carolina.
